

### **New Testament Lesson**

**Romans 14:1-12**

Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God.

We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the

living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. For it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me,  
and every tongue shall give praise to God."

So then, each of us will be accountable to God.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. ## THIS WEEK AT TRINITY

**CHILDREN'S CHRISTIAN FORMATION**—In typical times, the first Sunday after Labor Day kicks off our Sunday School year. Since our atria will not be full of sweet voices quite yet, we wanted to provide you with some activities that you can do with your family at home. We have created a curriculum for several weeks study of prayer. The plan is for each family to read a designated scripture together and answer three discussion questions. There will be one scripture/questions for each week of September. This activity is meant to be done once a week at the dinner table or before bedtime. It should only take about 10-15 minutes.

And perhaps the best thing we can do is realize that we have been all along.” Talking to our children about faith and spirituality can be daunting, but it is much easier to sit and wonder alongside them.
